





CLASS HISTORY

Our town must have looked the same as on any other day to most people on Tuesday, September 4, 1945, but to the fifteen original members of today's graduating class, Christopher Billingsley, Hugh Clark, Marjorie Conner, David Dix, Mary Fiegl, David Herry, Hugh James, Gail Johnson, Alan Jones, Marcia Larson, Carlton Plummer, Carol Plummer, Roger Riemer, Jeffrey Smythe, and Noralu Woodworth, it was the beginning of twelve long years of attempted education. Robert Muchow joined the class in the fourth week and we progressed under the able guidance of Miss Lucille Artlip that year.

In our second year we were joined by William Woodroe, Mary and Barbara Schmitt, Marcia Voelker, Paul Roth, and Claude Cooper. With the aid of Mrs. Etta Miller, the Senior Class of 1957 learned to write.

In the third grade there were seventy three pupils, who were for the first time divided between two teachers, namely Miss Elinore Patten and Mrs. Lillian Peters. We were joined this year by Richard Hoffman.

We were met with open arms in our fourth year by Miss Helen Lienhart and Miss Ann Dooley. Added this year were Mary Lois Porter, Barbara Retzloff, George Pritchard, Dale Harris, Kae Manning, Rae Manning; all of whom have since left us. During this year some of our characters began to take shape. Marjorie Conner had her first, much publicized, romance with Bob Muchow.

In our fifth year of academic endeavor, we learned the magic words, "Open see same," from Mrs. Marjorie Cooper and Miss Janet Rose Straub. This year we welcomed Jean Ames and James Rogers to our class roll. We recall in this year, very vividly, Bob Muchow, Teddy Teffner, and "closets".

Mr. Earl Warner and Miss Marjorie Dunham were the lucky recipients of sixty-two sixth graders. The Class of '57 was joined this year by Leonard Pritchard and Norva Everts. This was our first bout with progressive education, that is, we sat with our desks together and Mr. Warner explained the use of the pronoun "he".

As seventh graders we eagerly awaited this year when our days were to be divided into periods. We had reached junior high school. Our home room teachers this year were Mr. Horace Phillips and Mr. LaVerne Warner. For the first time we sent two representatives to Student Council; they were Carlton Plummer and Jeffrey Smythe. Fred Bentley, Paul Boreck, and Gail Hildebrant completed our class for this year.

Regents awaited us at the close of our eighth year. With this in mind we set to work under the supervision of our home room teachers, Mrs. Winifred Byerly and Mr. John Roloff. Among the departures this year were Virginia Albright, Carlton's true love), Bernard Barry, and Theodore Teffner. In Student Council we were represented by Jean Ames and James Rogers.

After we successfully completed our first experience with Regents, we awaited the exciting event of becoming Freshmen. This year we were really in high school and took pleasure in setting our classmates' lockers and in taking part in extra curricular activities. Miss Suzanne Parsons and Mr. George Kelly were the guides for fifty five determined students. Janet Mapes became a class member this year. Our class officers were Jean Ames—president, Gail Johnson—secretary. Marjorie Conner and Leonard Pritchard were Student Council representatives.

As we climbed the second step in high school we were under the leadership of Jean Ames—president, Carlton Plummer—vice president, Noralu Woodworth—secretary, and Carol Plummer—treasurer. Robert Muchow and Carlton Plummer were our Student Council representatives.

By our eleventh year we became dimly aware that we were completing our high school education. As a class, with president Jeffrey Smythe, we defeated the Seniors in the annual fund raising drive for CARE; and then refused to buy soft drinks for them at the Junior-Senior picnic. That year we lost Gloria Beales, and Norva Everts went on to graduate. Mr. Dilcher and Mrs. Bradley, our advisors, did their best to discourage us in the idea that we should be first in the lunch line as well as everything else.

Some of the Juniors crossed the boards for the first time this year in the Senior Play, "The Nervous Wreck". We sold candy, presented the annual Junior Prom, sold Christmas cards and sold refreshments at basketball, football, and baseball games, put on suppers and all the other fund raising projects that we could think of. The King and Queen of our magnificent Junior Prom were Jeffrey Smythe and Gail Johnson. The decorations were made spectacular with the aid of the "man on the flying trapeze" who fell "in the line of duty" two days before the Prom.

We started our Senior year off with a bang, with the annual Senior Play, "The Cannibal Queen". This year there was the last minute rush as many of our class members filed applications for college. With our class advisors and Mrs. Warner, our home room teacher, trying to check our enthusiasm, we set out on a rash of projects; supper, selling taffy, dances, selling yearbook advertisements and other sundry activities. Two of the few changes in our class roster this year were the addition of Mary Lou Hughes and the loss of Barbara and Mary Schmitt.

In addition to our projects we found a little time for school work. One of the reasons for this could have been that the chemistry class didn't have the same makeup as last year's physics class. Mr. Herry whipped us through trigonometry, "I don't say Trig is your most important subject, just do it first"; and Mrs. Warner squeezed us through American Flistory to the accompaniment of "Now folks". With Bob Muchow as our class president, Marjorie Conner as vice president, Jean Ames again treasurer, and Gail Hildebrant as secretary, Carlton Plummer, Claude Cooper, and Chris Billingsley in Student Council, we glided through our Senior year all too fast, in contrast to the other years. We had long awaited graduation and upon its arrival made our bow as the Class of '57.






A junior band was started in the elementary school system which promises to add much to the development of the senior band in later years.



Congratulations, girls, for the good work.


