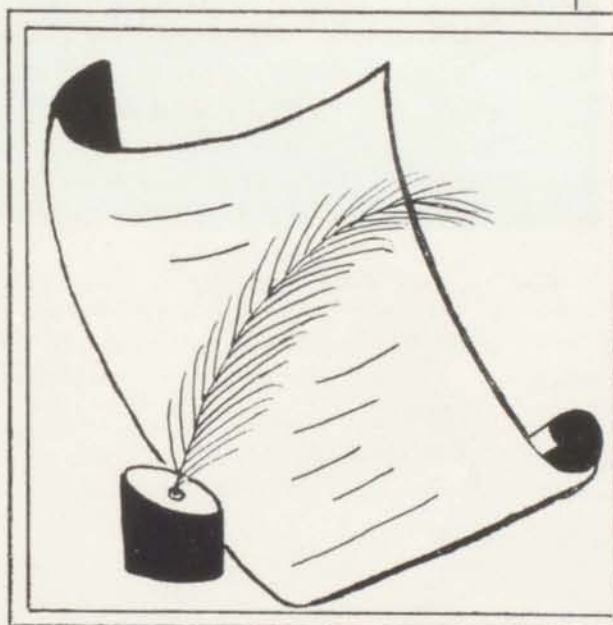
Because they are as important as the proverbial "readin', writin', and 'rithmetic", we dedicate our yearbook to the intangible ideals of life.

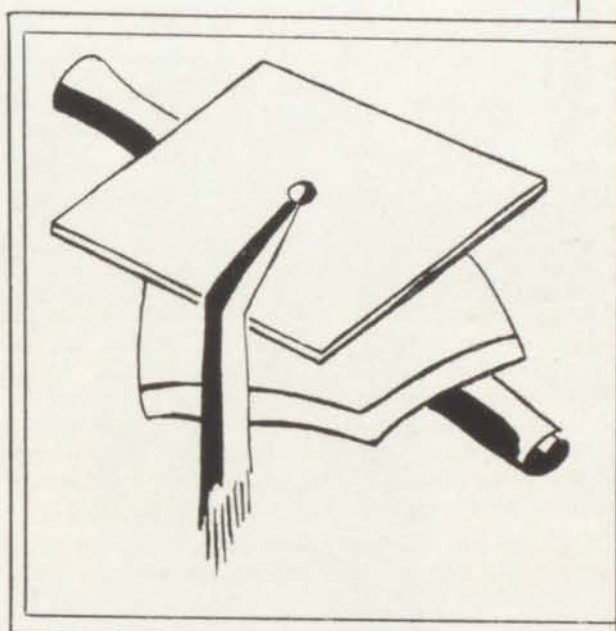

CLASS HISTORY

In 1948 we started our second grade under the guidance of Mrs. Schnackel and Mrs. Miller. Patricia Thomas, Joan Mapes, Robert Simsik, Yvonne Thomas, Bonnie Giblin, Corrine Munzel, and Linice Lewis entered our classroom to begin with us the serious task of "readin', writin', and 'rithmetic."

With the advance of 1949 it was seen that our school was overcrowded. As a result our class was placed in the Town Hall for that year. Mrs. Peters and Miss Patten (Bluhm) ably held us in check during this time.

Our fourth grade found us back in the high school. Miss Dooley and Miss Lienhart were our overseers this year. Julia Donald, Gloria Gilbert, Carol Waters, Lawrence Manning, and Virginia Ames came to join us at this time.

Miss Straub and Mrs. Cooper were our instructors during our fifth year. Mary Fitchlee and Gordon Canham came into our class as the "young" years quickly flew by.

With the addition of Patricia Smith our sixth grade, headed by Miss Dunham and Mr. Warner, was the half-way mark, meaning harder work was to come our way.

By the time we had reached seventh grade, some students had left while still others had come to replace them. So when Mr. and Mrs. Phillips were our educational navigators our class had fifty three pupils.

Nineteen hundred and fifty-four saw the entrance of these students into eighth grade. Mrs. Byerly and Mrs. Phillips along with our other teachers bolstered us for the frightening prospect of our first Regents Examinations.

Finally high school and the home stretch. The thrill of our first lockers, the joy of picking our own subjects, the "horseplay" for which we were so seriously reprimanded were made known to us. To hold us back and teach us the mature ways of students were Miss Parsons and Mr. Kelly.

In our Sophomore year bake sales were our main project to help us raise funds for our Senior trip. The faculty worked diligently to help us form our minds and to help us with our decisions.

As Juniors we realized with alarm that we had only a short time left to remain in school. Time was going fast as we put on suppers, sold candy and hot dogs at games, and as our main project presented our Junior Prom at which Judy Kenyon and Hugh Fraser presided as king and queen. Our advisors, Mrs. Byerly and Mr. Plummer, led us along with advice as to how we could prepare for our Senior year. With regret we saw Pat Smith move away and Ted Byerly leave to go ahead to graduate.

We became Seniors at last. The annual Senior Play, this year called "The Fakers", was presented. Our class zealously sold magazines for a new sales record. At Christmas time our Senior Ball was presented with success. The final semester was spent in busy preparations for our Senior trip, the annual yearbook, and most of all — final exams.

Much has happened to us since that first year of school twelve years ago. We hope we have absorbed enough knowledge to find success in the world.

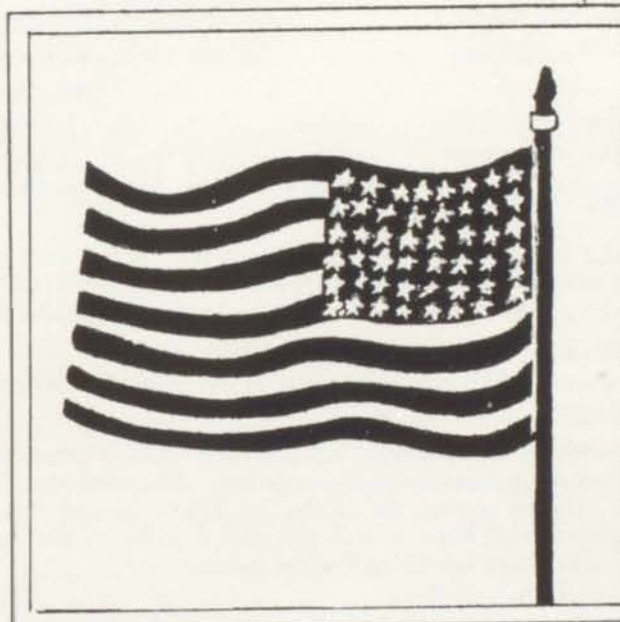
