My father earns his living as a forester. My mother is a part time teacher and also the local head of one of the national policital parties.

## Summer Program



The Lyndonville Central School District conducted their fourth summer school session in 1969 under the direction of Mr. Roy J. Plummer. The main emphasis was the instruction of children of seasonal farm labor workers. Classes were also of fered in driver education and music.
