Summer Program



The Lyndonville Central School District conducted their fourth summer school session in 1969 under the direction of Mr. Roy J. Plummer. The main emphasis was the instruction of children of seasonal farm labor workers. Classes were also offered in driver education and music.

Seven elementary classes were organized with a total enrollment of 110 students, while the driver education program had a class of 20. The federal guide lines stipulate that elementary classes shall have from 10 to 15 students each and the instruction shall be developed to help the individual achieve a greater self-concept. Field trip experiences and classroom work were presented that would expose the traveling child to the community and the surroundings of New York State that he is currently residing in. Our students came to us from Georgia, Florida, and Texas.



Physical education, under Mr. Arnold Hartsen, was an integral part of the summer program. Activities ranging from organized games, games of perception, mimetics, team games, skills, apparatus and track were participated in by the students.
