

The Road to Success ...

"Kids are super . . . I love them," says Mr. George Tripp, the guidance counselor here at Lyndonville. "I'm not God; I can't solve all problems, but I am someone who cares enough to listen. I'm not here only to change schedules."

George Tripp taught Social Studies at Wilson High School for five years, then became guidance counselor at Newfane Jr. High. From there he went to West Seneca but disliked his job because the school was too large to get to know the kids. He came to Lyndonville in 1974 and is very happy here because the school is small enough for him to get closer to all the students.

He went into Guidance because he loves kids and enjoys working with them, hopefully guiding them toward the right path for a successful and happy future. "Kids aren't aware of guidance. It isn't here just for the preparation of college. My whole goal is to make students acquire a more positive self-concept. They have to like themselves before they can go out and achieve a successful career.




They have to start early and find out who they are and what they want to be."

Mr. Tripp has found time to set up programs which include speakers from several colleges, group sessions, College Nights, and sessions with past Lyndonville graduates who return to talk to students about the things they encounter at college.

Each year he also organizes certain programs that center on each class. During one's freshmen year, Mr. Tripp discusses career education and the values of decision making. For Sophomores, he continues working with their career educations and conducts an aptitude test. Juniors take the Ohio Vocational Test and meet individually with him to discuss the procedure for narrowing down their interests and what they will do after they graduate. Seniors meet both in groups and individually frequently with Mr. Tripp, in order to finalize their plans.

"Everybody has his own problems and kids always need someone to talk to, but sometimes it's hard to find someone who cares enough to listen. I know it seems like I'm busy all of the time, but I try to talk to as many







students as I can. As I mentioned before, I'm not here just to make out schedules and get kids interested in college, but also for personal problems, such as drugs, pregnancy, and family life.

"A lot of teachers get upset with me-they think I always have to be the good guy-mainly because they think I support the kids over them. Well, my number 1 concern IS the kids and I want the students to know that they can turn to me if they need help."

Mr. Tripp's advice for kids concerning careers is, "Get involved in the things that interest you and talk to as many people as you can who have gone through these similar decisions before. Decisions are made through searching and gaining experience-just keep trying and do your best. There are a lot of decisions to be made. Start early, search for confidence, and most of all, strive to work to the best of your ability."







Varsity Basketball




Thank-You Mr. Hartsen

Major activities included a canned food drive with competition among homerooms.


Mrs. Hogan's Junior homeroom collected the most cans and won a free pass to the Christmas Dance featuring the new rock group "Rox"

TV Repairman


