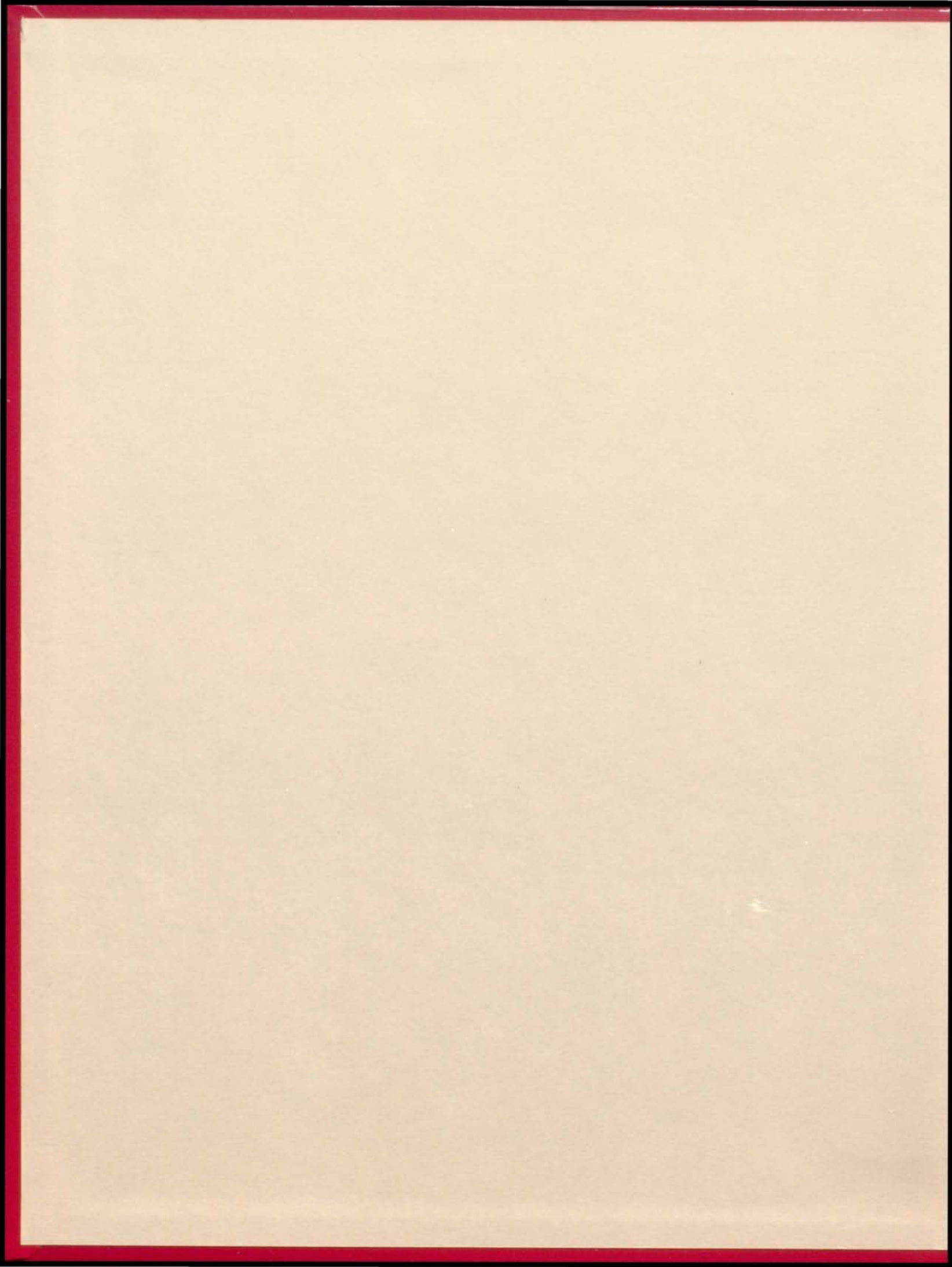

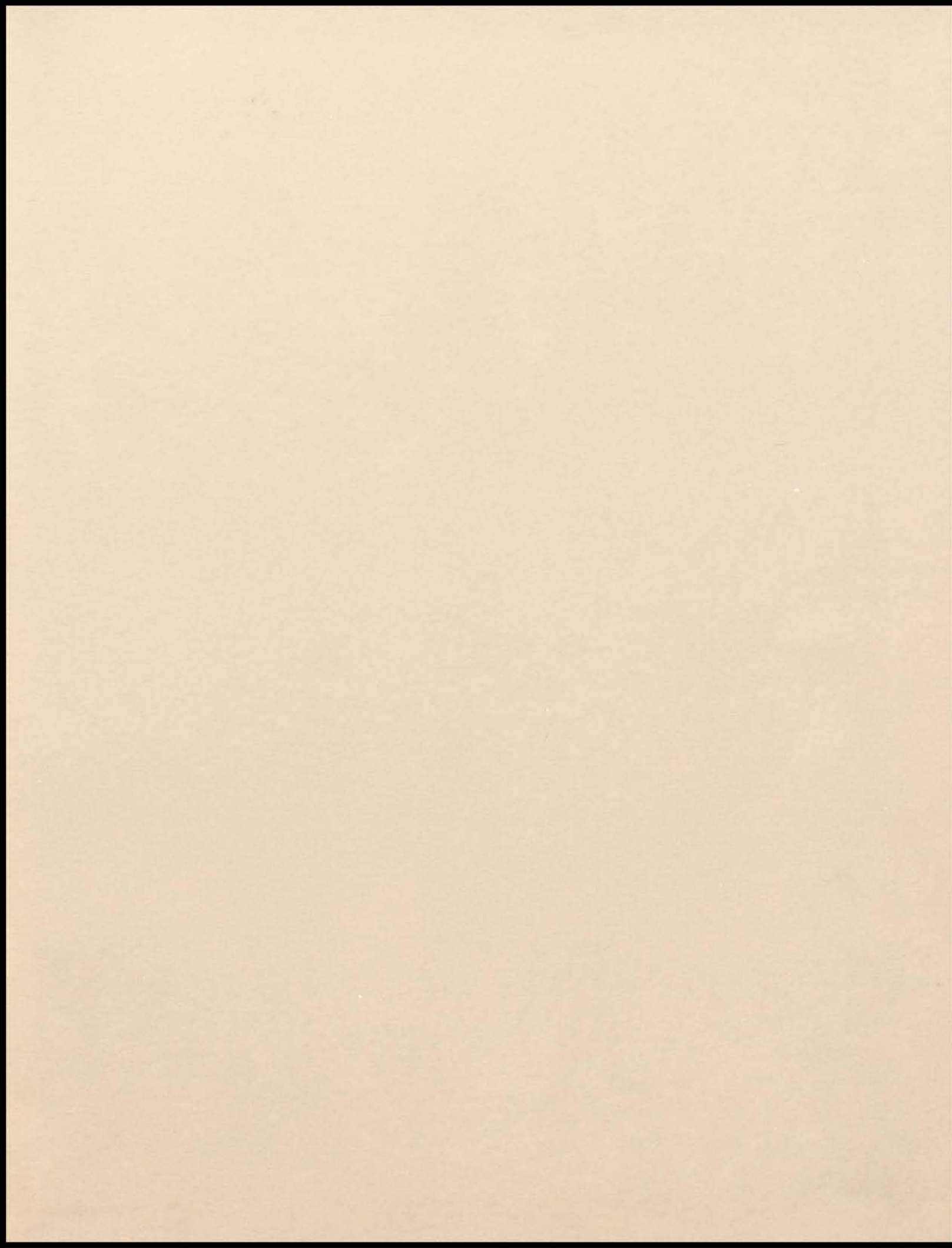

LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

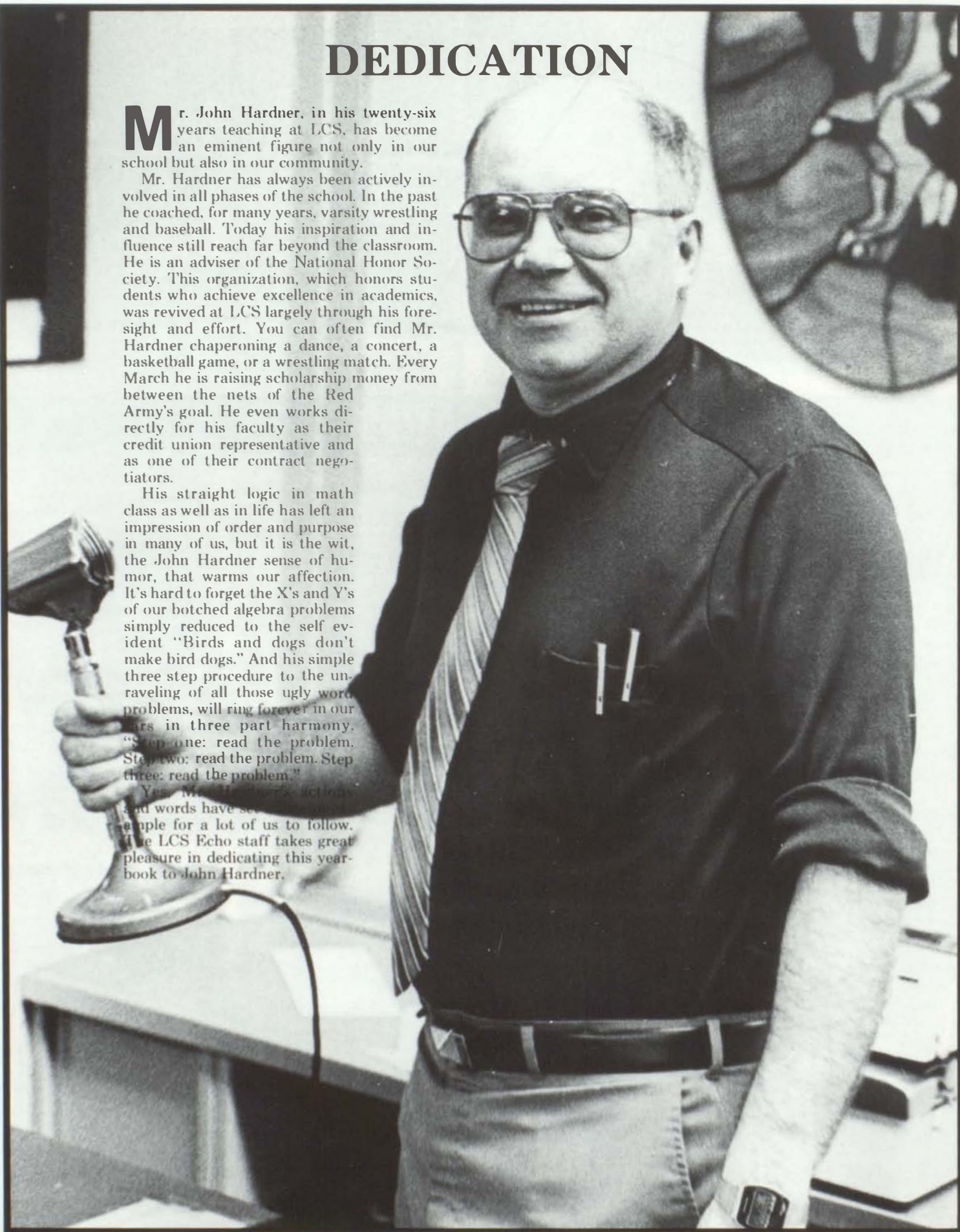
DEDICATION

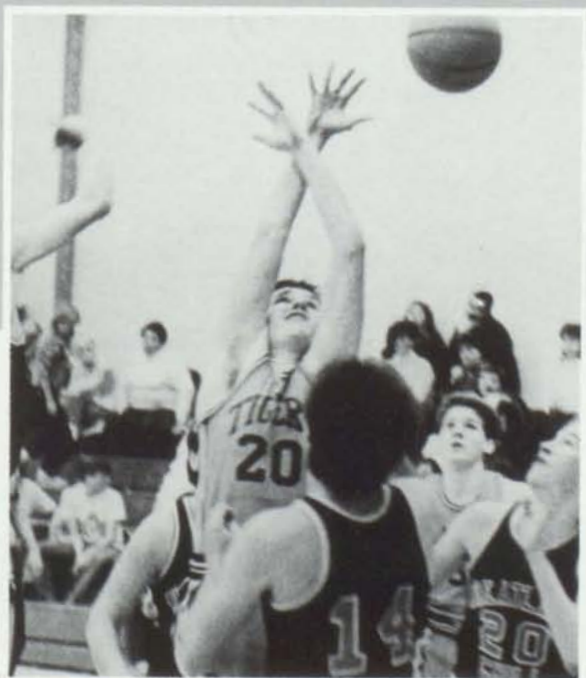


TIGERS CAN'T SHAKE TROUBLES

That training and preparation produced another fine year for Tiger grapplers, for after coming off a fantastic sectional title last year, Lyndonville posted a solid 9-4 season this year.

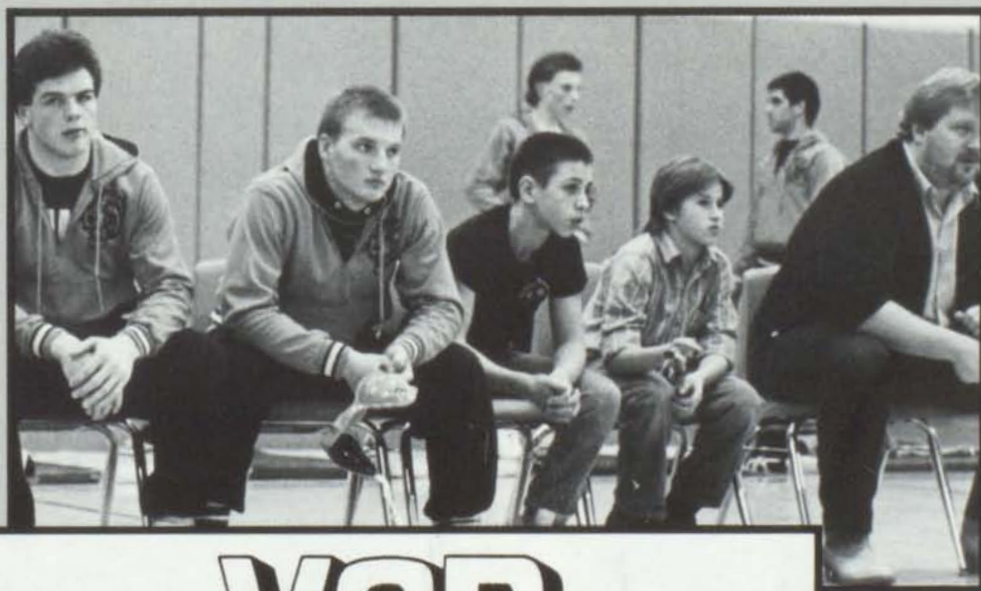
“Success comes from doing all things well,” says Gawne, and he proved that against high powered Niagara-Orleans league representative, Albion, by beating them
