


TIGERS FLEX MUSCLES

Then the team set its mind on sectionals, hoping



Defense was the key to the TIGER team. The stingy back five allowed an average of only 1.1 goals per game.








HEIDEMAN NETS 32 BIG ONES


New Coach; New Look






Lyndonville Bad Boys

When asked to sum up their season Coach Hughes replied, "The girls did everything I asked them to do. Hopefully, they had fun and enjoyed themselves along the way."


