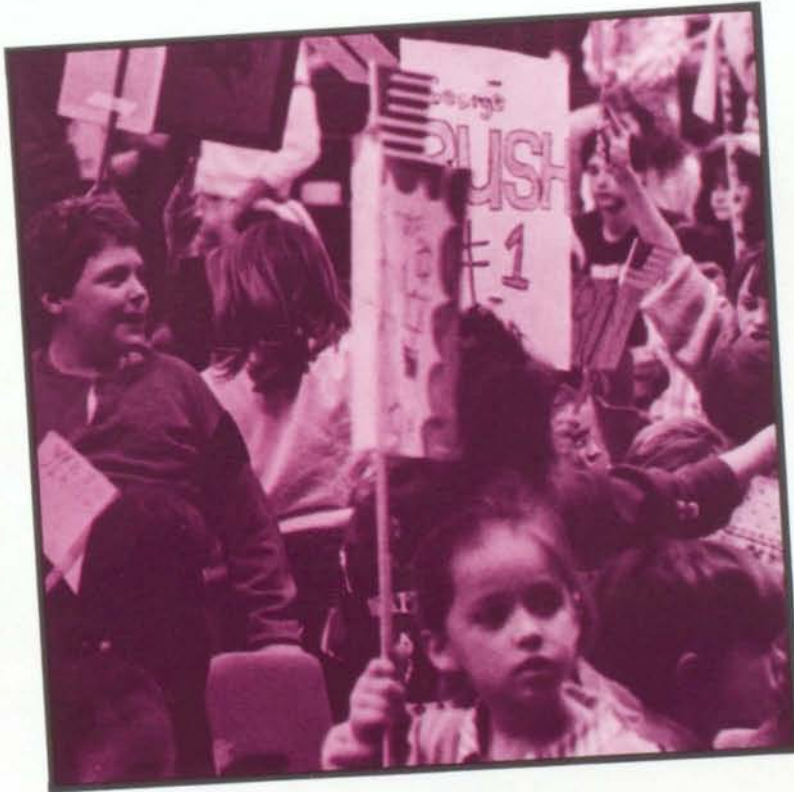

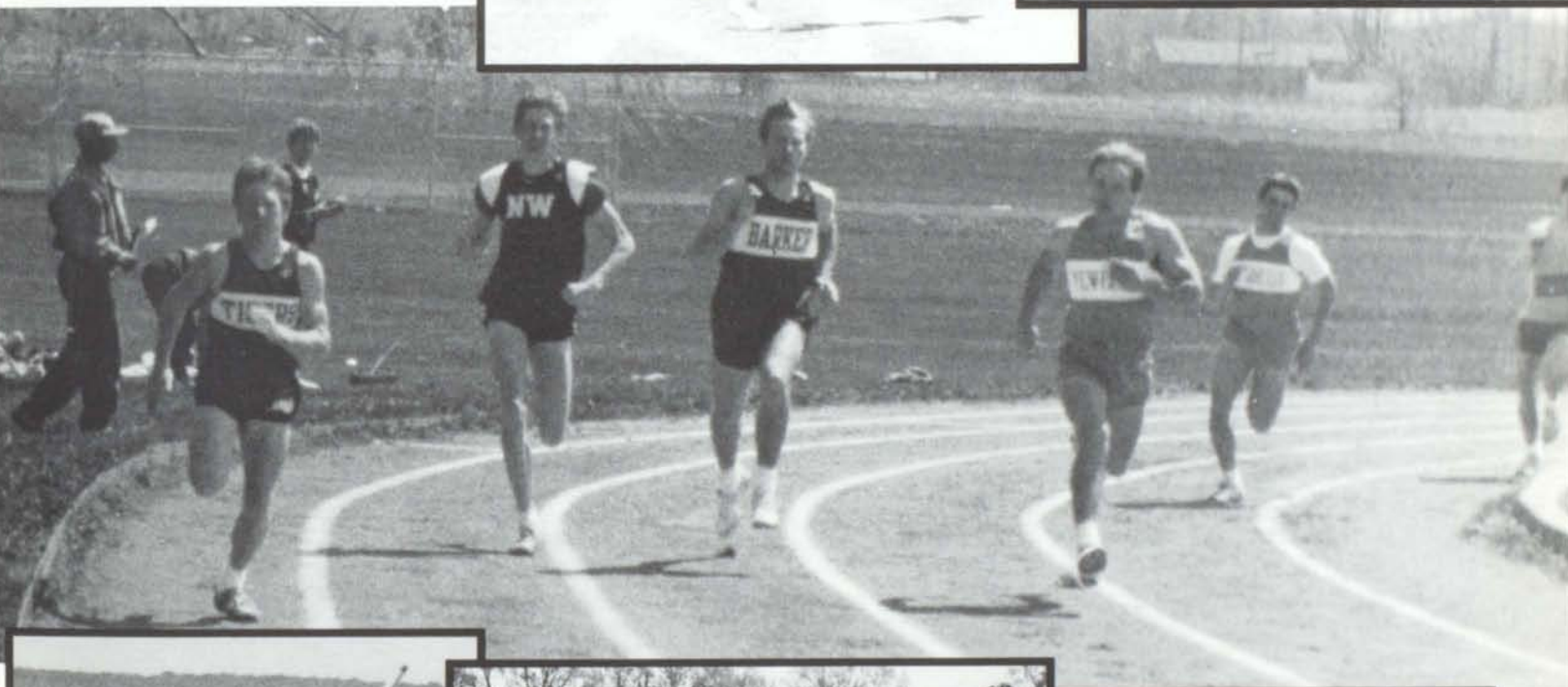

# CLASS DAY

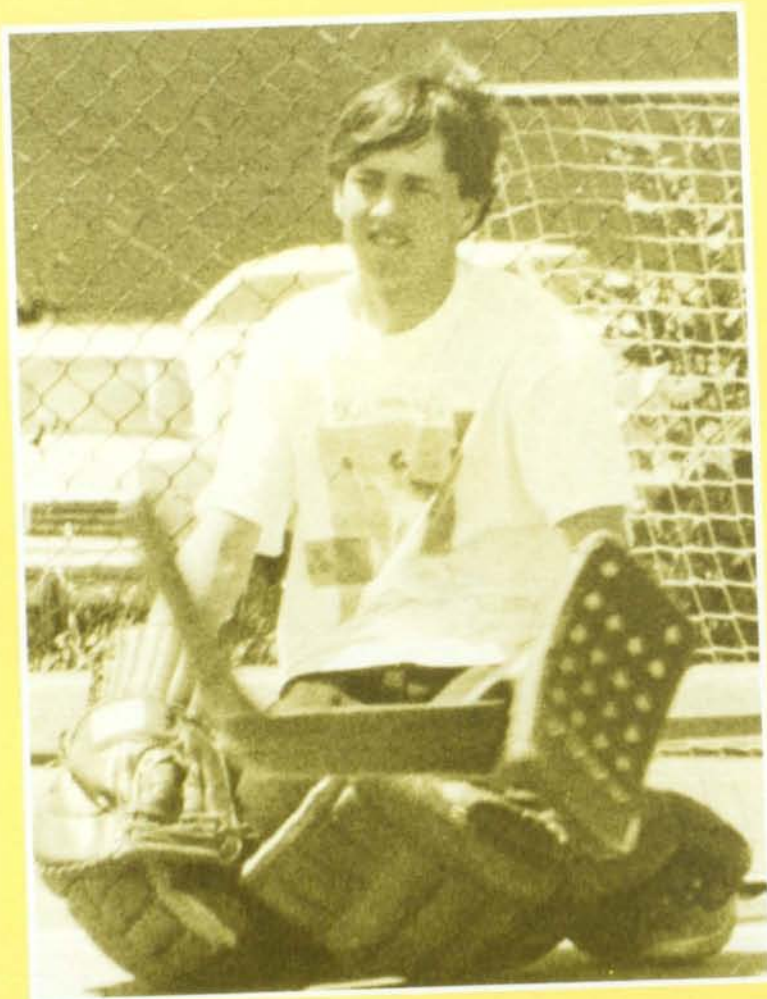
Class Day is a tradition of the senior class. It is a day to recognize their talents and their academic accomplishments, and it is a day to watch everyone up to a lot of fun along the way.

## J.V. Girls "Battling the Odds."

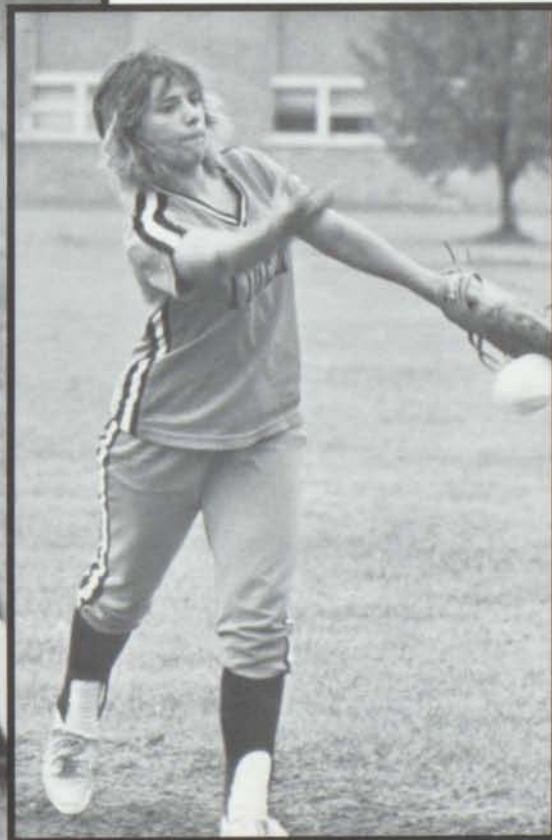

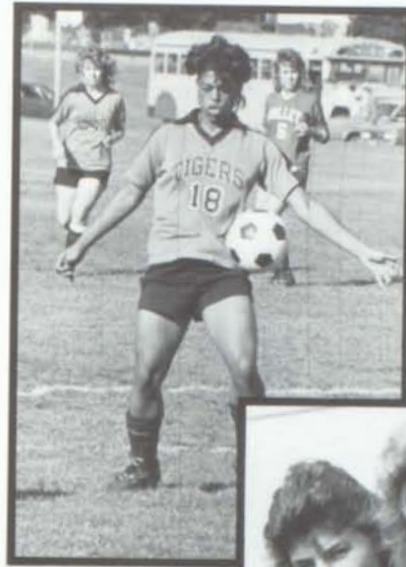
The Prince and Princess were Greg Breeze and Faith Wypychowski.

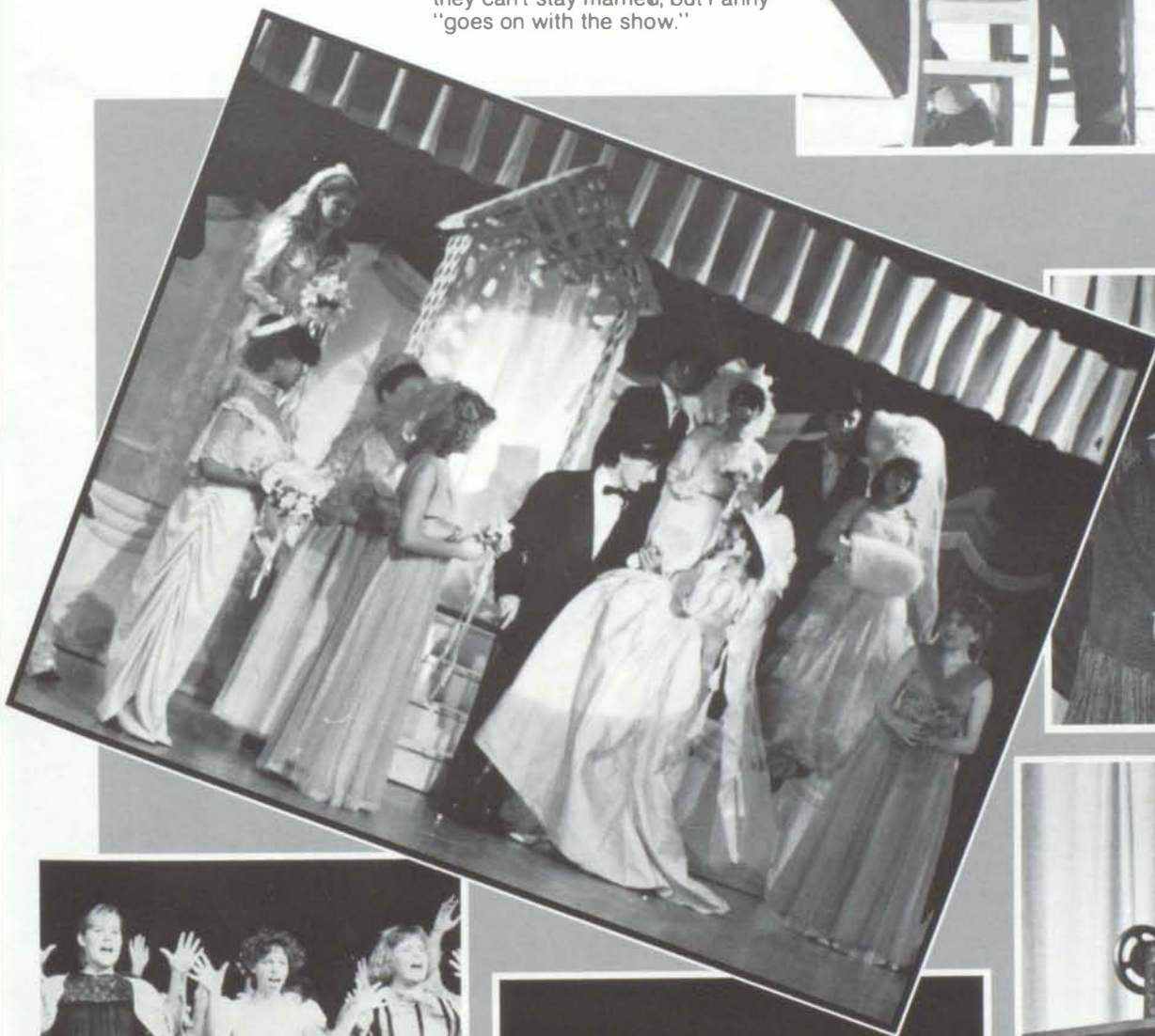




# FUNNY GIRL . . . BIG SMASH!

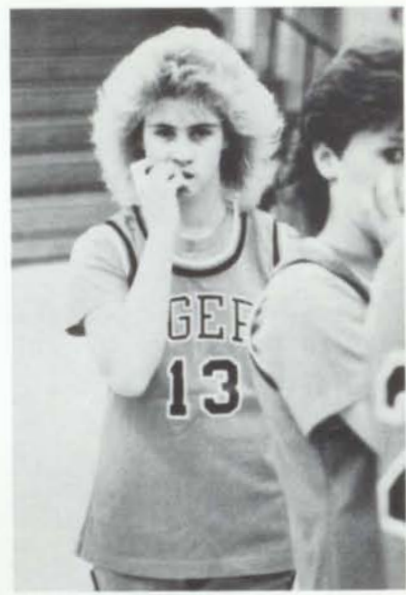


## GIRLS STRUGGLE
